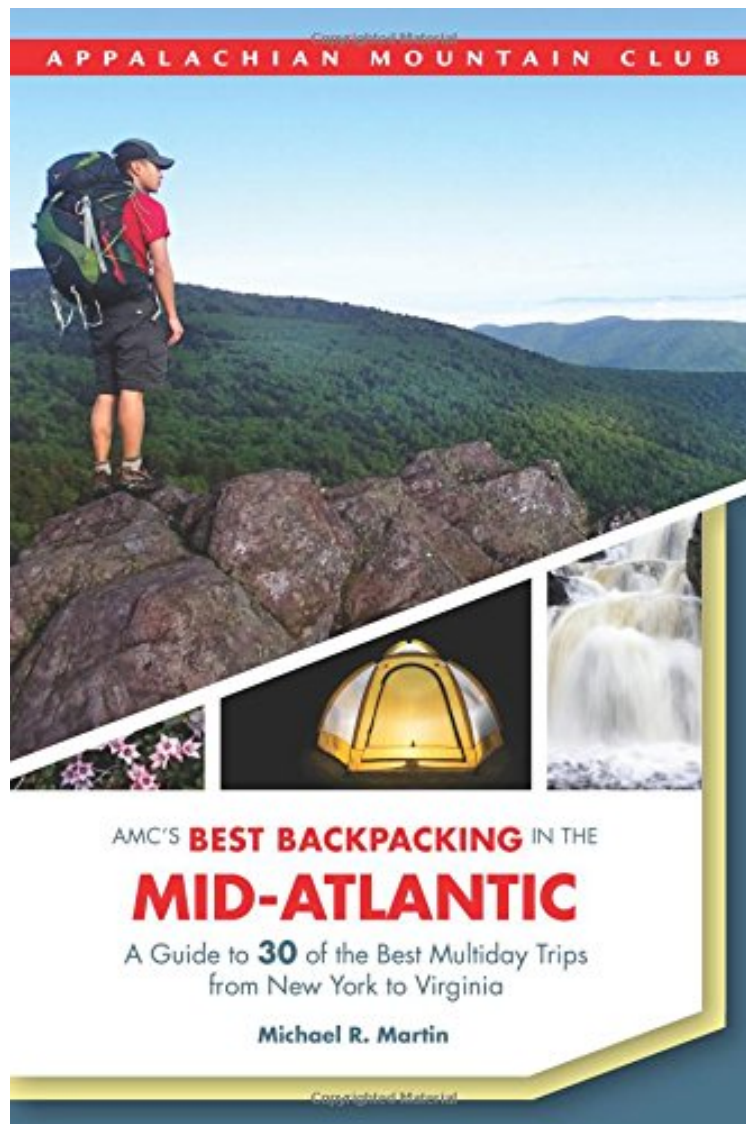

Martin's trail descriptions are clear and very helpful, and his general advice in the early chapters is useful, even for experienced backpackers. One suggestion would be for him to include GPS coordinates for trail intersections, particularly for trails in poorly marked areas, such as the Monogahela National Forest (coordinates for suggested campsites are included, but this more significant data is not).
