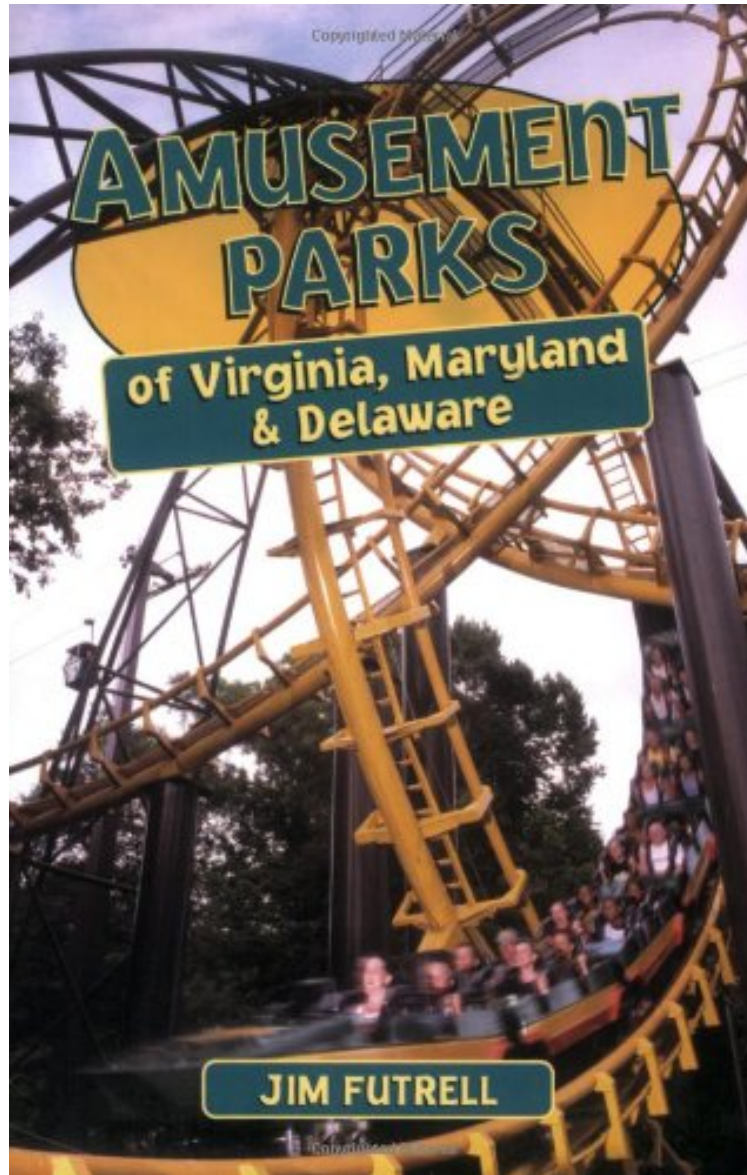

My one problem with this

book is that it seems like it was written directly from promotional material, so whereas this provides a great walk down memory lane for the larger parks like Busch Gardens and King's Dominion, it also makes a crappy, rundown, overpriced, poorly managed tourist trap like Trimpers on the Ocean City boardwalk sound like it's going to be an amusement Mecca. Thus after reading though the book, the reader will have no idea that parks like Frontier Town and Funland Rehoboth are wonderful little gems you'll just love to death, whereas a park like Jolly Roger kinda sucks, and Trimpers should be avoided all together. Aside from that, something that would have been nice for a comprehensive look at the parks would have been a year-by-year bullet-point list of what went in and what came out of each park. Most major rides were discussed and dates or at least rough time periods were given, but it would have taken little effort, at least for the major parks, to though this in. 4 of 5 people found the following review helpful.
