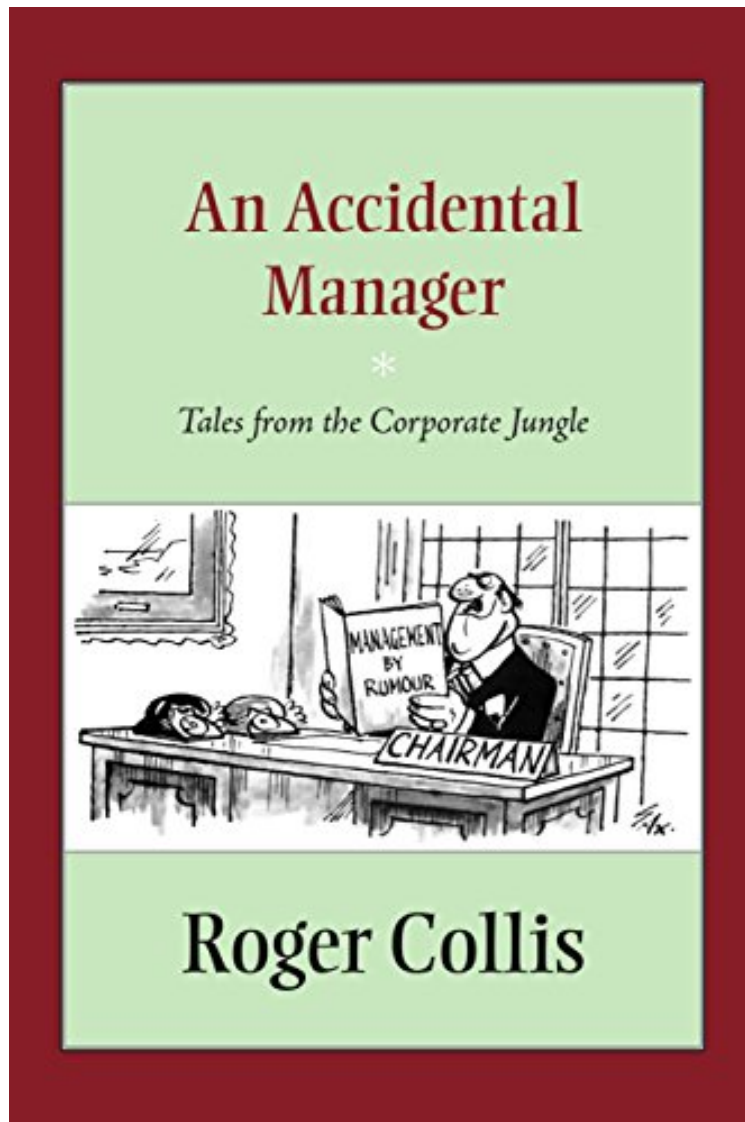

At a time when management is increasingly seen as the grasp of quantities, not qualities, this selection of over 130 articles written over a 30+ year period is a breath of fresh air. The author draws on his own experience in high pressure global advertising and marketing, and on his mix of UK, French, Swiss and American corporate contexts. The style is mostly satirical with a delicate ambivalence as to how much of what it describes actually happened. It is in effect a guided tour of the everyday problems faced by well-meaning mid-level managers, challenged by ever-changing contexts, cultures and technologies, as seen by a latter day Geoffrey Chaucer. As in any good guided tour, the reader never knows what is coming next, although substantial themes do emerge as one progresses. This compendium is humane, even humanistic in its highlighting of human foibles, ingenuity and weaknesses.
