Extremely interesting read from historical sourceBy robert englehardtThese 2 volumes were very interesting as they were written just after the American revolution although only includes up to actions leading to the revolution. This book was written by an inhabitant of Charleston SC (a minister) who apparently exhausted many primary sources that were then available. Extremely interesting to hear of the terrible

hardships the early settlers faced as well as the proprietary system they worked under until control taken (by colonists desire) by the crown. I learned a lot regarding the interactions with the Indians and how the neighboring Spanish and the French (and the English) used them in proxy conflicts against each other. Much was written about the unhealthy climate of the lowland areas and the difficulty establishing crops- having no idea what crops would grow there and many without basic knowledge of farming techniques. I found especially interesting reading the author discussing hurricanes and trying to determine the cause of them, describing tornados for his countrymen who had little experience with them (describing the sound like waves crashing etc as the train how most people describe now hadnt been invented yet!), and how no one really knew what all lay on other side of Appalachian mountains or where the Pacific Ocean really way. Obviously the author had a loyalist bent on his analysis but that doesnt take away from his view of history from a lot closer to that time of colonization and time he lived around the time of the revolution. This book may not interest many people but it is free and written before 1800- that makes it very cool to begin with. 1 of 2 people found the following review helpful. disappointed By Mom Davis was just a review not the complete book, I tried to download free books for my daughter and thought this was the complete book, it was not.
