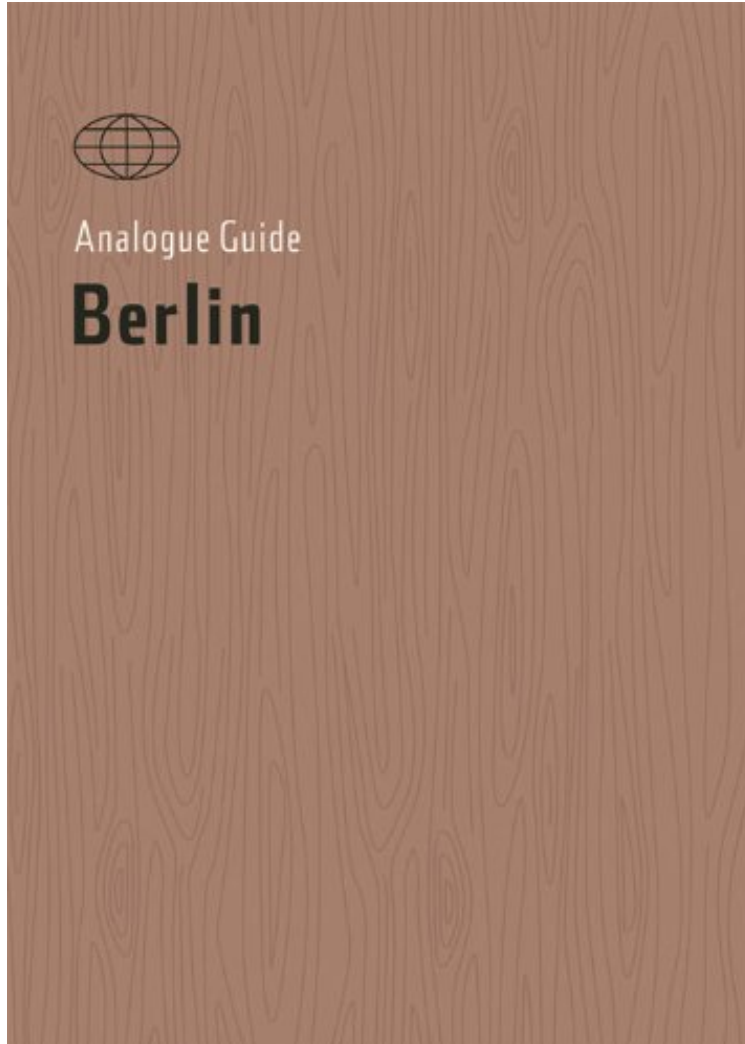

The listings are supplemented by user-friendly maps to facilitate navigation of the cityscape. By highlighting aspects of the urban patina frequently lost under the corporate veil of large restaurant groups and ubiquitous chains, the mood and feel of each unique city is captured. The result is a compact, efficient manual celebrating the ingenuity of the contemporary metropolis. Berlin is probably the most happening city in Europe today and certainly the most fascinating of the continent's major capitals. Though undoubtedly a more mainstream city than it was two decades ago, its unique history has left it with a diverse set of neighborhoods, architecture, and people. In the former East, Mitte has dramatically shifted from socialist decay to the embodiment of contemporary Berlin, boasting innovative retail and a vibrant art and cafe scene. The city's alternative-creative edge has spilled from Kreuzberg into Neukölln. In the West, Charlottenburg and Schöneberg exude the air of prosperous 20th-century West Germany.
