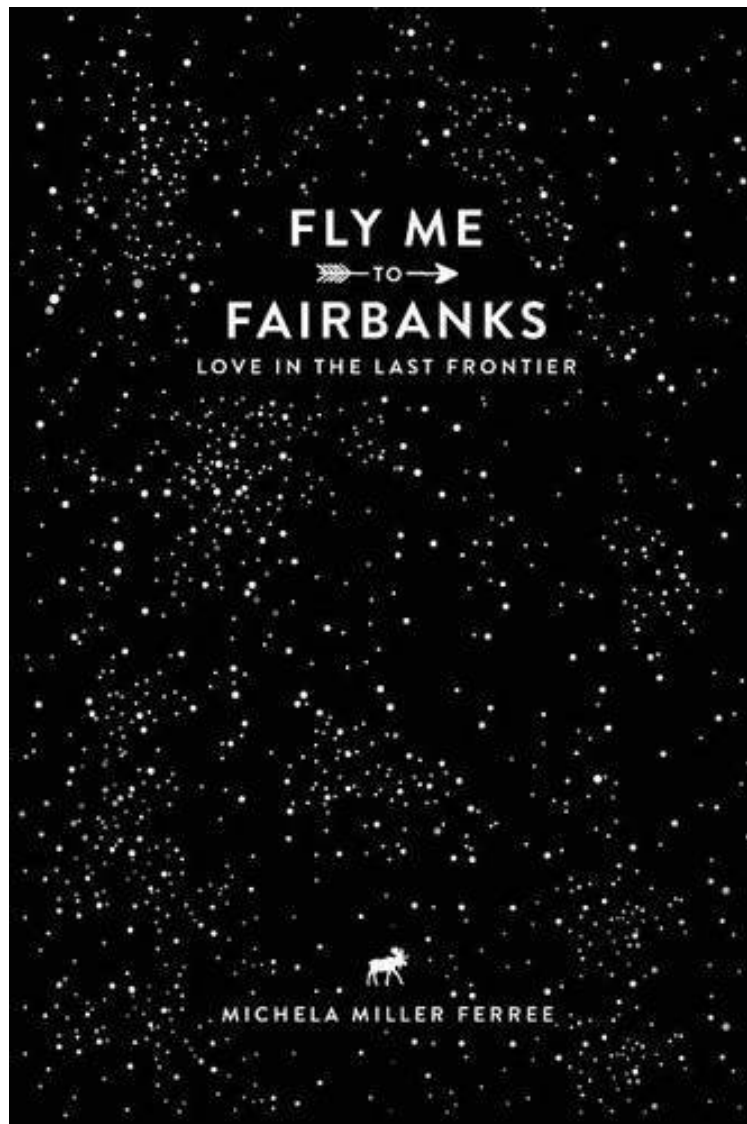

In a manner similar to Bill Bryson, Michela weaves her story within a framework of

Alaska's history, folklore, geology, and natural and man-made wonders, so that by the end, the reader suddenly realizes that he's learned quite a lot about the state. Her colorful and sharp-witted commentary regarding the experiences of a small-town Midwest girl trying to acclimate herself to the climate and culture of the Last Frontier guarantees many laughs, but by the end of the story, Michela's admiration and love for Alaska and its people, and especially for one particular guy named George, is obvious. *Fly Me to Fairbanks: Love in the Last Frontier* is worthwhile read in every way.
