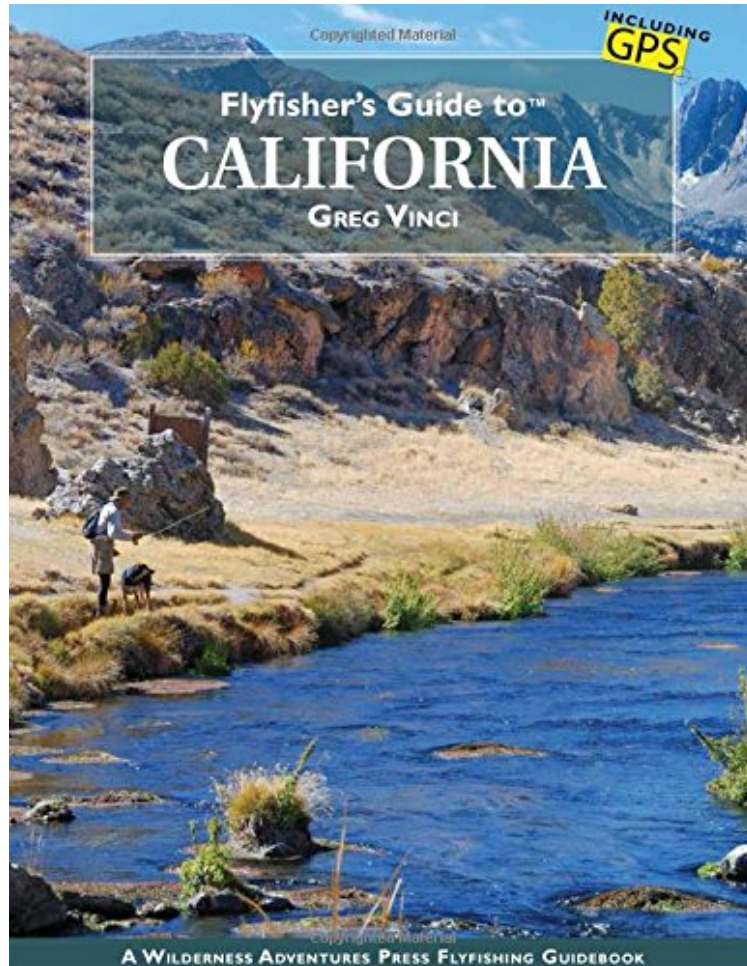

However, the info could be more condensed, and the personal stories were enthusiastic but a bit cheesy -- I personally highly useful information over sentiment. I think a 2nd edition is in order, maybe include some more waters (or, more detail) and make sure the maps are accurate (e.g. tried to access below Englebright Dam, but it turns out it is closed, and the map does not indicate this). A second edition could also make sure the hatch charts are all squared away (e.g. they sometimes list fish species under the "insect" category, which makes it seem quickly made).
