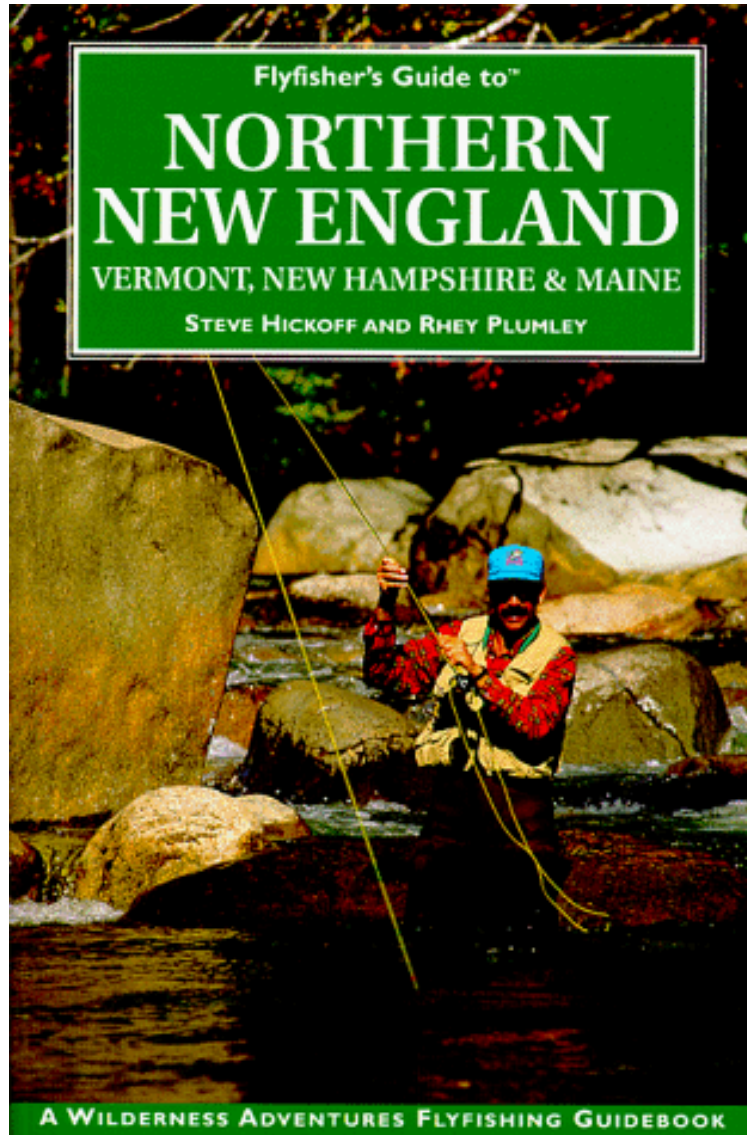

The book only covers 3 main rivers I believe, which is unfortunate because there are SO many amazing rivers in central NH/Ossipee area.
