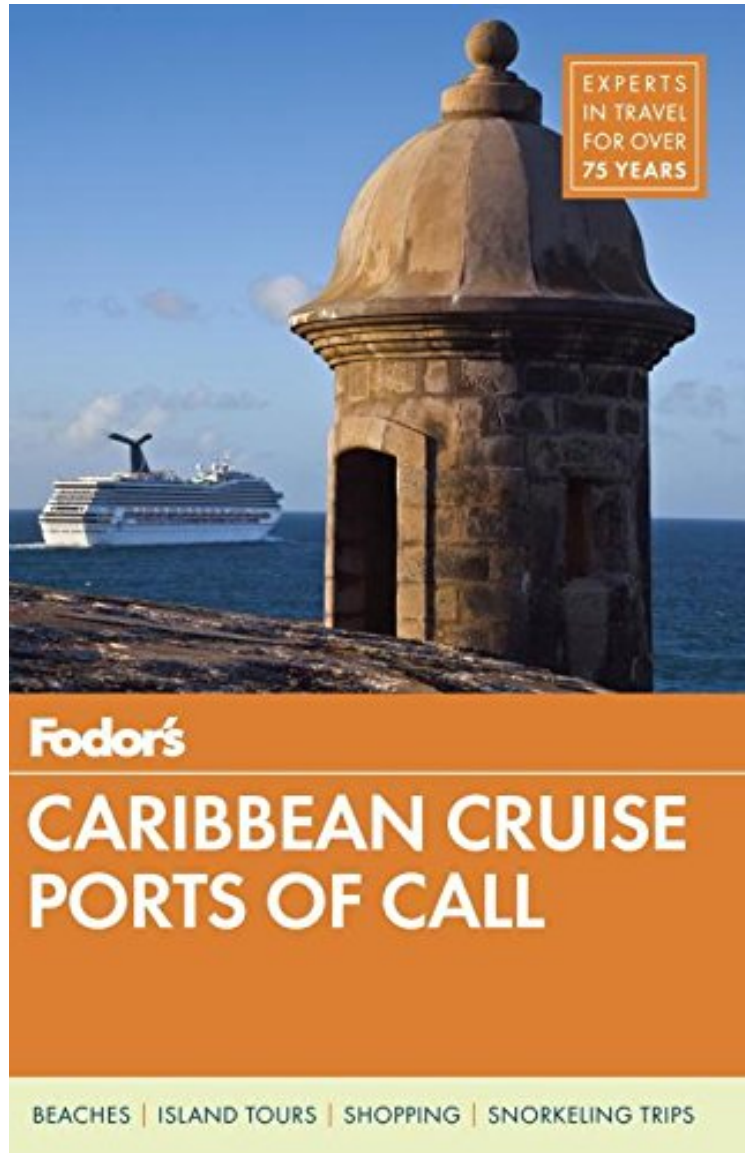

It seems to be this way for most of the ports in the "Embarkation Ports" section, and many of the ports of call are similarly less than a page long.
