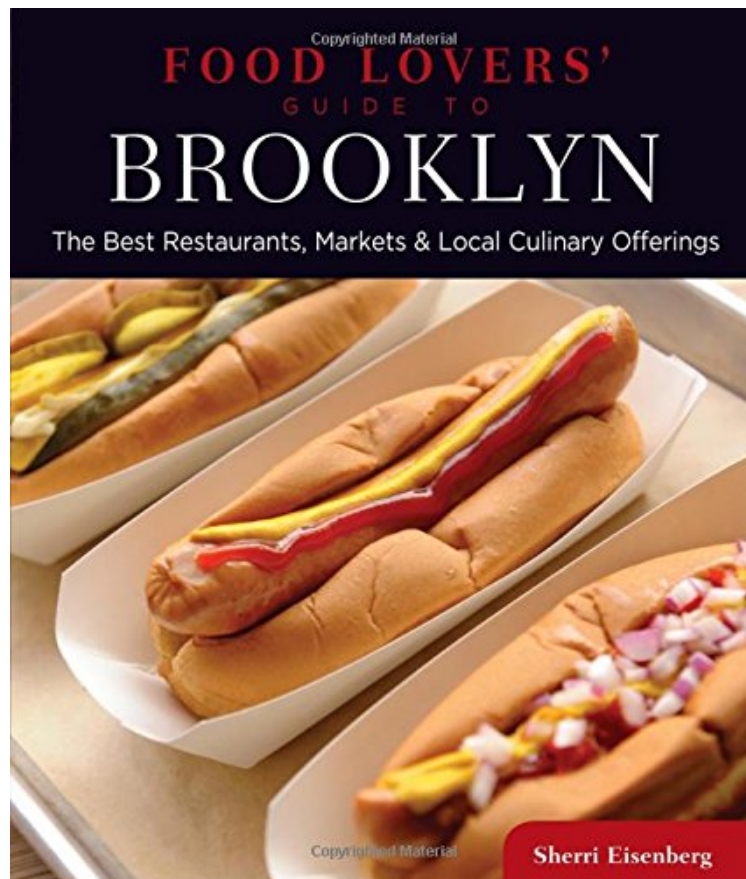

Unlike the similar books about Manhattan and Queens, excellent maps are given of each set of neighborhoods covered, pointing out the various restaurants, cafs and food stores listed - a major plus for only this book, sorely
