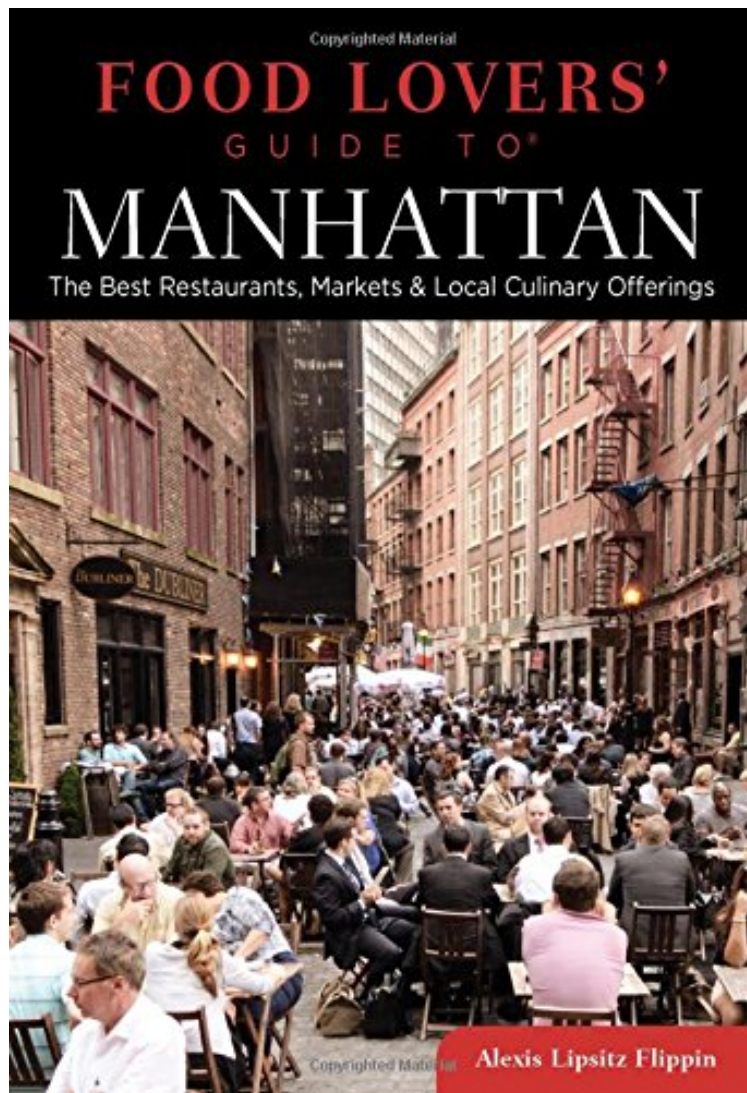

In the main section, chapters on each district have sub-chapters called "Foodie Faves," detailing restaurants of interest in the area; "Landmarks Old-School Faves" (similar); and "Specialty Stores, Markets Producers," listing interesting shops and markets. Each restaurant entry indicates the establishment's price range. The books about Brooklyn and Queens are similar; but the Brooklyn book does not indicate the genre for each restaurant (a flaw).
