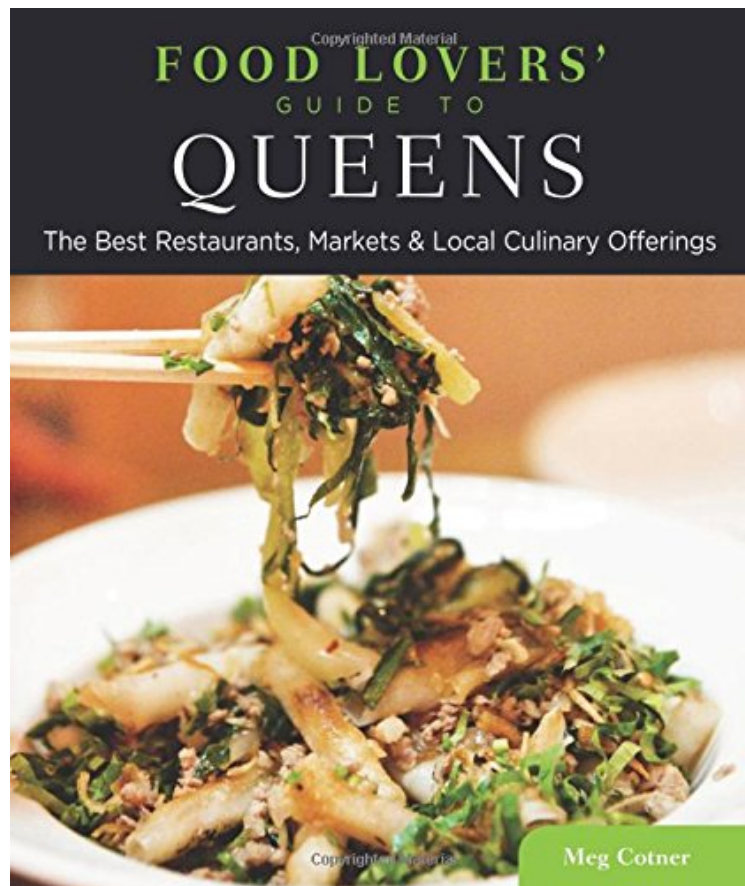

Kennedy Airport, is a great place to eat, featuring a plethora of cheap but excellent little eateries, of many of the cuisines of the world. This stands in stark contrast to hyper-dear Manhattan! For tourists, it justifies even trekking out to Queens at the end of each day in Manhattan, just to eat. And that is only for the deprived souls who have not yet discovered Queens as a destination in its own right - there is a wealth of things to see and do in Queens! When will there be similar books about the Bronx and Staten Island? The only reason this review must receive a less-than-perfect mark is that, like the similar Manhattan book, this one lacks the excellent neighborhood-specific maps provided in the equivalent Brooklyn book - a major

flaw, which must be rectified in the next edition, as well as in that of the Manhattan book. Brooklyn may have lots of culinary attitude, but Queens has chops (pun intended). You nearly need a passport and a dozen foreign language dictionaries to fully explore its food-intensive neighborhoods. But even better, you can use this book which is an excellent, highly detailed, enthusiastic, and practical guide for traveling on your stomach from Astoria to Bayside to Corona and beyond. There are details about lots of restaurants at all price points, but to me what makes this book really useful are its details about scores of ethnic food shops, with information organized by neighborhood, including how to get places by subway and bus. If you're having a craving for something from your Turkish/Sri Lankan/Italian/Polish/Thai/Croatian/Malaysian grandmother's kitchen, head to Queens with a copy of this book and you'll find it.My only complaint with the book, and it's a small one, is the frequent use of the word "foodie" which I find trivializing and annoying.
