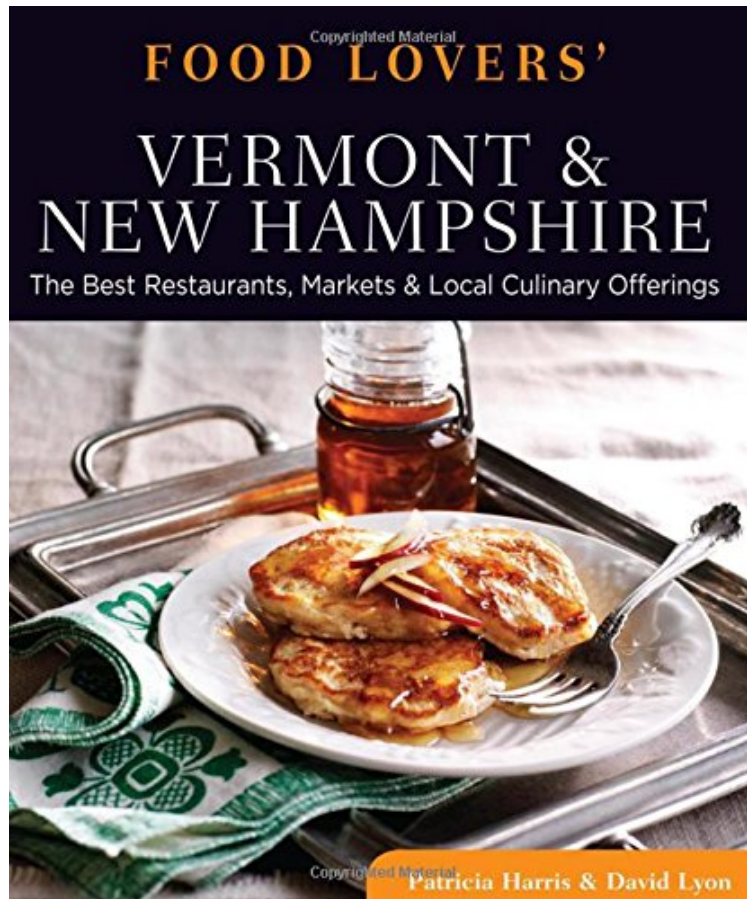

Unfortunately, at least 60% of the restaurants we chose were closed or out of business altogether. Vermont is not densely populated with restaurants so if you are not in Burlington, foodies should expect to look ahead on their route and detour to find a restaurant. Also be aware that many restaurants outside of Burlington have specific serving times and late lunchers or late diners might

find themselves out of luck! This book did guide us to several fantastic places which we will eagerly go back to, but I am highly wary now and would probably use this book within range of internet service so that I can get the hours of the establishment and make sure they're even still in business before driving out of my way.
