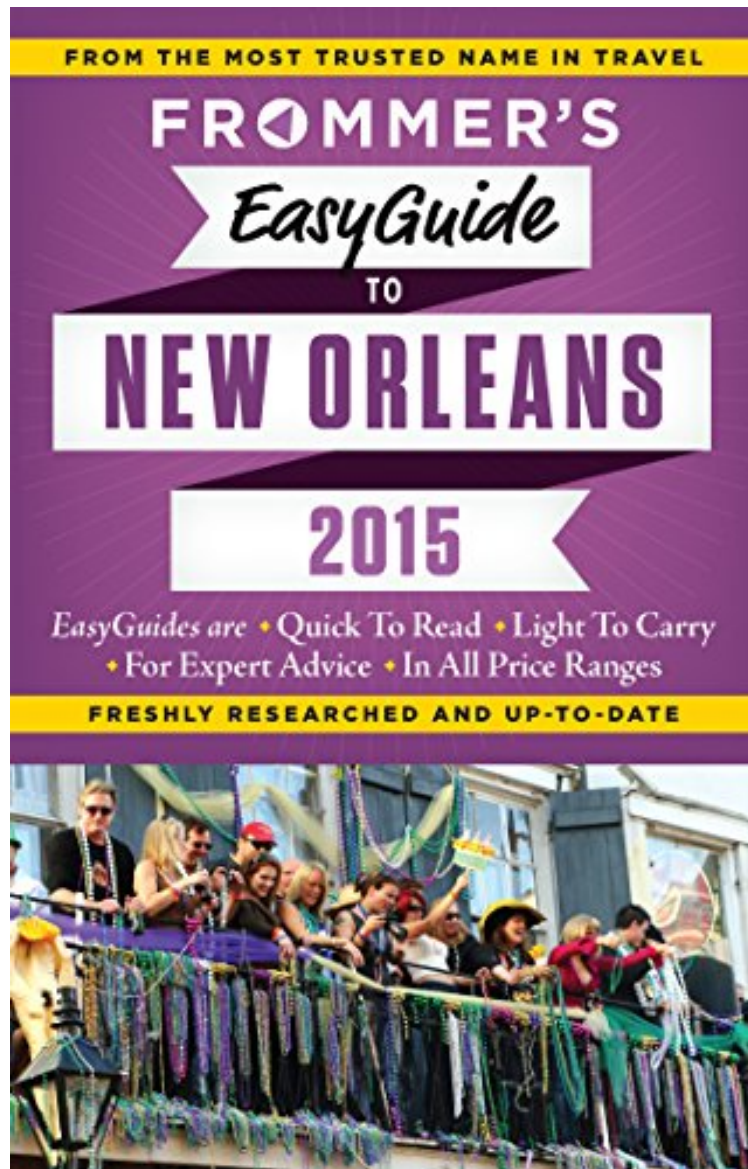

outstanding. First, the listings are comprehensive and right up to date. If it's new and hot, or old and classic, you can be sure it's included here. New Orleans is absolutely crammed with superb dining, lodging, shopping, and hopping options, and the sample included here is selected for quality and authenticity. Second, the physical, geographic coverage is exhaustive. Sure, the French Quarter is well represented, but so are other interesting locations. There are separate sections for Mardi Gras and Jazz Fest, so this is a good guide for planning trips to those festivals. It includes excursions to River Road plantations and to Cajun Country without diluting its coverage of New Orleans proper. Despite its modest price and a couple factual errors (LSU is most definitely not in Lafayette), this is the best New Orleans guide I've used to date. 9 of 9 people found the following review helpful. I was able to book some excellent tours off this book's recommendations. Also, I appreciated the book's balance of the very tourist-y and more local sights, restaurants, etc. The only negative comment I have is about how the book is organized. The book provides so much detail in regards to the history of the city and its hotspots (which is great!) that it's organized in a way that doesn't allow you to access sections quickly. It also doesn't utilize formatting as well as I think it could. For example, I found myself flipping back and forth in certain sections trying to relocate the name of a tour service that was mentioned; it was hard to spot because it was only bolded in a lengthy paragraph providing background information about another site.
