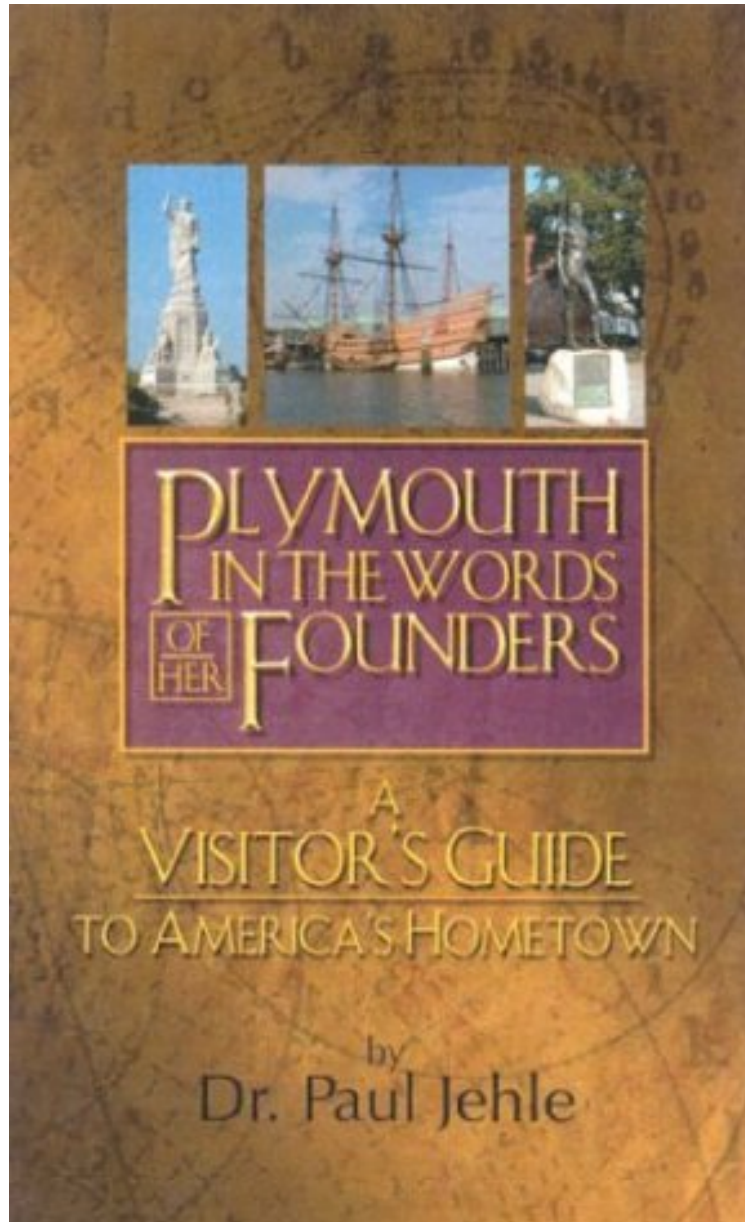

Speer This is an easy-to-read booklet for those off the beaten tourist path with an interest in history and philosophy/christianity. The second half is devoted to what is probably Plymouth's best kept secret: The Forefathers' Monument, a beautiful and impressive 81 ft. granite statue overlooking the town, which none of my friends had ever heard of. The monument artistically and philosophically depicts five main figures (Faith, Morality, Law, Education and Liberty), several smaller figures connected to the five larger ones and scenes of the history of the plantation. The worldview of the pilgrims and the citizens of the last century are explained through the interdependency and rich symbolism of the five figures of the monument: No liberty without education, no education without law, No law without morality, no morality without faith - an abbreviated version. The first half of the book is devoted to the history of the pilgrims and their settlement. Through personal accounts of 400 years ago, it brings to life the persecution, the aspirations and struggles of these pioneers, upon which our country was built. It gives brief descriptions of various monuments and other sights worth seeing and puts them into the historical context of the settlement. It made our return visit to Plymouth exceedingly rich.

There have been many guidebooks printed about "America's Hometown." They give information on museums, old houses and activities for residents and tourists alike. All are recommended by the author who has an affinity and love for the town of Plymouth. This guidebook, however, is unique. It attempts to interpret the specific monuments erected in memory of the Pilgrims, Plymouth's founders. After twenty-four years giving walking tours, researching the monuments and the intent of the their sculptors as well as the writings of the Pilgrims, Dr. Paul Jehle has let the founders of Plymouth interpret the symbols erected in their memory. Plymouth is a town that has been besieged by revisionist historians and special interest groups intent on presenting an anti-Christian and politically-correct history of America's spiritual birthplace. Thanks to the testimony of historian and pastor Dr. Paul Jehle, the tide is turning. For the first time ever, visitors to Plymouth can have a well-documented overview of the monuments and sites of America's spiritual birthplace in the words of the founders of Plymouth and America themselves.
