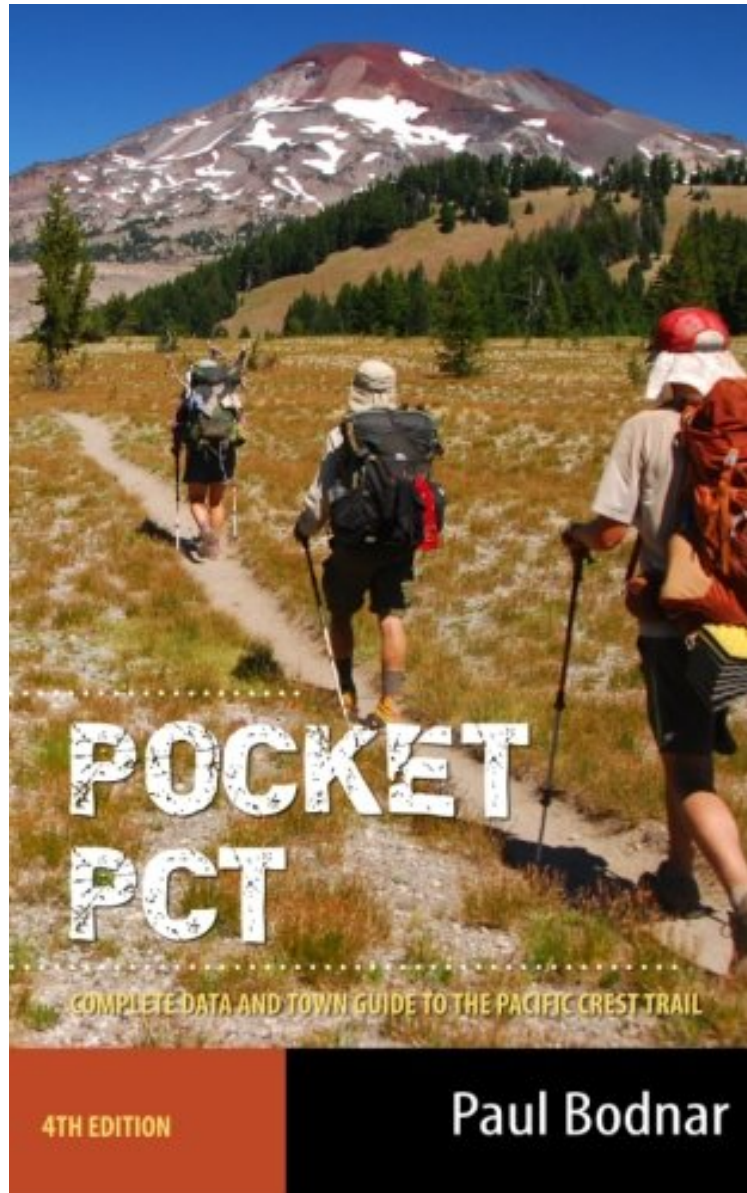

For example, It would be great if Paul put in book short explanations of how to get from trail to specific town, or/and simplified map of towns. Also, some of icons were not so acurate. For example, for Hiker Town it says there is a little store. Yup, that's true, but in that store you cannot buy almost nothing for trail. The Pocket PCT contains an elevation profile and important landmarks on the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT). Each chapter begins and ends at a common resupply location. The elevation profile is broken into ten-mile segments, showing the trail's elevation in feet. Water sources, landmarks, roads and trails are indicated above the elevation profile line. Additional important town information is also provided. The mileages are compatible with Halfmile maps and the Guthook's Pacific Crest Trail Guide app (iPhone Android). The book is lightweight (4.9 ounces), compact (5 by 8 inches) and just over a quarter inch thick.
