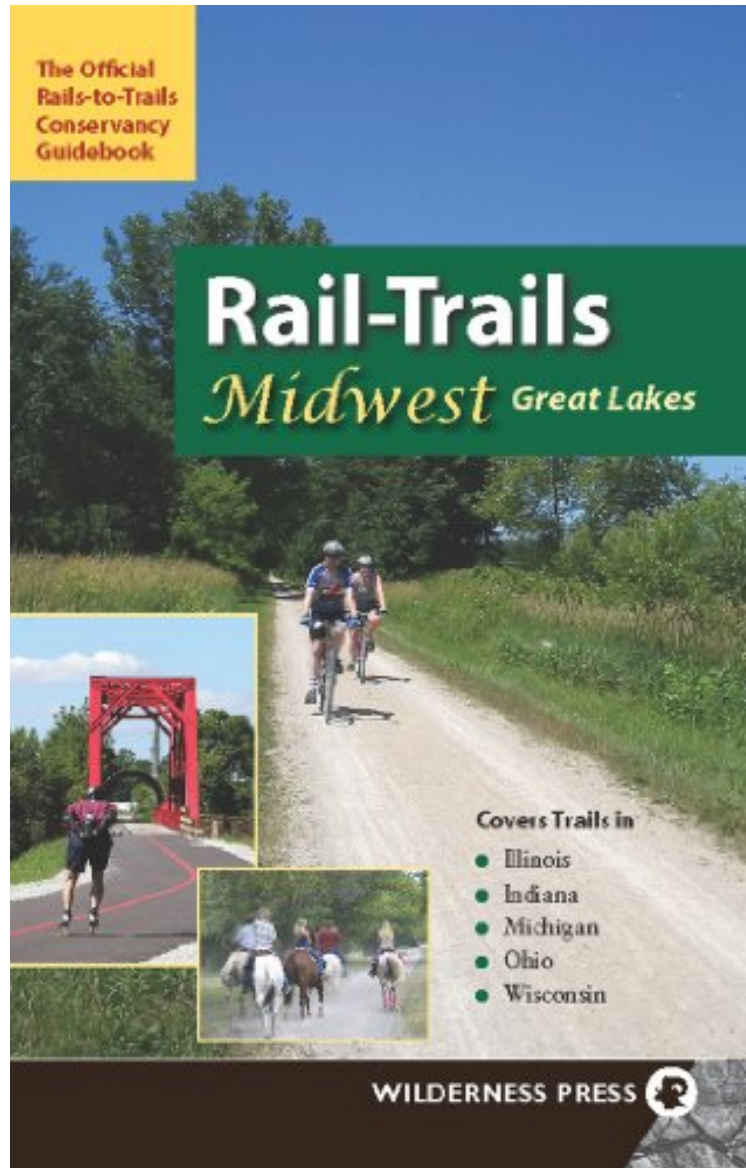

I like that a clear overview map is included for every ride so you get a good sense of the ride before you go. The good descriptions of what you'll see along the way help choose a ride. You have to read the detailed descriptions to tell how much of a ride is actually on a trail, versus streets or highways, and even then it's not always real clear. Since it focuses on rail-trails, many fine and fairly level trails aren't included. Finally, keep in mind that the book is copyright 2009.
